COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Classes are about 2 hours of recorded video per week (some are a little longer and others a little shorter). Along with video classes, we will have a 5 Q&A sessions (3 Hours). This will give you a chance ask questions in real time with an instructor. Q&A will be held on Thursdays from 5-7:30PM. Attendance is mandatory and will determine your grade for the course.

Recorded classes are released on Monday morning by 2PM. You'll have 7 days to view the classes. In this time, you can watch the class as much as you like. If you walk away from your device while viewing a class, the time stamp will stop. If your computer is left idle, the time clock will stop recording. You must login and view classes for 2 hours each week to receive attendance credit.

Classes come down on Mondays by 1PM

ATTENDANCE POLICY: In accordance with current AIMC policies, students must attend a minimum of 80% of all course meetings, or a minimum of 12 classes for a 15-week course, to received course credit. Quizzes will be 10 multiple choice questions. The content will be based on the previous week's video lectures and live Q&A class.

The final exam will be 100 multiple choice questions. The final exam is taken online and will be available on the last Thursday (December 13, 2018) of the term from 5-8PM.
